



The mandate of assembling documents assigned to the ITS does not have the archival assembling work as its aim, but it is the prerequisite for the best possible completion of the mandate "evaluation".

Considering the large number of first inquiries arriving each day as well as the 505,000 applications which are already on hand at the ITS, but which had to be answered negatively at an earlier date because of a lack of records, the efforts to obtain stocks of documents available at other offices become understandable. Only this renders it possible to issue extensive information to numerous former, present and future inquirers.

The examination of individual fates shows how important even the smallest indication may be for one single inquirer. It can be decisive for a "YES" or "NO" with respect to a pension or indemnification. An ITS-internal "Meeting-system" guarantees that newly acquired information, registered according to names and inserted into the Central Index of Names, meets with former inquiries that are already on hand. The ITS then automatically sends the newly ascertained information to the respective inquirer.
