It is therefore presumed that towards the end of 1944 — beginning 1945 the Kommandantur of Gross-Rosen was evacuated to Reichenau (Gross-Rosen records).

Transit camp: Capacity about 40000 Jews, transferred from Novaky. In 1941 the inmates were transferred to Poland (War Crimes Commission).

Transit camp: Capacity about 40000 Jews, later transferred to Sered. In 1941 the inmates were transferred to Poland (War Crimes Commission).

THERESIENSTADT—TEREZIN

Add: CC Kdo. of Flossenbuerg, first mentioned on 31. 5. 44, when a transport of 910 prisoners of CC Gross-Rosen on transfer to Flossenbuerg, went to Theresienstadt (Flossenbuerg Nr.book).

Add: "Auffanglager" of the Staatspolizeistelle Karlsbad, mentioned 5. 7. 39 (Dachau Records).
