 Add: CC Kdo. of Auschwitz III-Monowitz Established on 8. 4. 43 with 286 pris., on 8. 10. 44 this  
 Kdo. had a strength of 1069 pris. From 8. 4. 43 to 31. 8. 44 there were 8 death cases. Work  
 details employed by Steinbruch 1, 2, 3 and 4 and Kalkofen  
 (Auschwitz III-Golleschau monthly strength reports).  
 The "Kommando Buch" of Golleschau contained 2348 pris.

 (former inmate).

 CC Kdo. of Plaszow, FLC: First mentioned 1941 as FLC Mielec working for the Heinkel Flugzeugwerke,  
 guarded by Werkschutz. In 1944 FLC Mielec became a Kdo. of CC Plaszow with an average  
 strength of about 2000 pris., among them also female inmates (former inmate).

 CC Heidelager, established Aug./Sept. 1943, after the transfer of skilled workers from CC Szebnie,  
 closed June 1944, the pris. being transferred to CC Auschwitz and to Gleiwitz. Average strength  
 5000—6000 pris. working for the nearby lying trainingcamp "Heidelager" of the Wehrmacht.  
 No Kdo's, independent, own administration (former inmate).  
 FLC: First mentioned in Nov. 39, as a sub-camp of Debica (former inmate).
