

YUGOSLAVIA

BANJICA

CONCENTRATION CAMP: 4—5000 prisoners, of them 1500 women; there were transfers to CC Dachau in Aug. 44 (former inmates).

BOR

near Nisch

FLC: ZAL for Jews with camps "Berlin", "Dresden", "Innsbruck" and "Vorarlberg", established June 42, approx. 10000 Hungarian Jews, 5000 Italians, 2—3000 Yugoslavs, 1—2000 Greeks and other nationalities. Working in a copper mine, constructing tunnels. Evacuated in Sept. — 28. 10. 44 to CC Flossenbuerg (former inmates).

OBECESE

near Ujvidek

FLC: mentioned in April 1941, doing clearing-work on fortifications. (Statement of one former inmate, no other confirmation).

SABAC

CONCENTRATION CAMP: Total strength increased 17.—24. Oct. 41 from 15724—16445 prisoners. Up to this approx. 1000 prisoners had been shot as hostages. (OCC WC Nuernberg.) After the transfer of 400 prisoners to establish the new CC Zasaviza on 8. 10. 41, CC Sabac was to be closed and all prisoners were to be transferred to this new CC. CC Sabac was to be transformed into a Transit Camp and Dulag 183 would probably take over the whole camp (Photocopied order of Comm. Gen. in Serbia).
