(COMPLÉMENT AU CATALOGUE)

Lors de la parution, le 31 mars 1950, du deuxième volume du Catalogue des Camps de Concentration et Prisons établis en Allemagne et dans les pays occupés, j'avais indiqué aux lecteurs qu'un certain nombre d'informations intéressantes et de valeur ne manqueraient certainement pas d'être encore recueillies au cours des mois suivants.

On se rendait compte alors, comme on se rend compte aujourd'hui encore, étant donné le nombre considérable de camps de concentration, de camps de travail, de ghettos, de prisons, etc. établis par le parti au pouvoir pour exercer le contrôle sur les Allemands et les ressortissants des pays occupés et favoriser la réalisation des ambitions militaires de l'Allemagne, étant donné par ailleurs les ramifications innombrables et le caractère extrêmement compliqué de leur administration, qu'il est pratiquement impossible de retrouver et de donner des renseignements exacts sur chacune de ces installations.

Bien que, par conséquent, le Service International de Recherches ne puisse prétendre avoir épuisé le sujet, il pense devoir présenter à ceux qui ont reçu les Volumes I et II ces cent vingt huit pages complémentaires qui donnent la liste du matériel trouvé depuis mars 1950 et comprennent des informations inédites concernant les ghettos juifs établis dans différents pays après 1939.

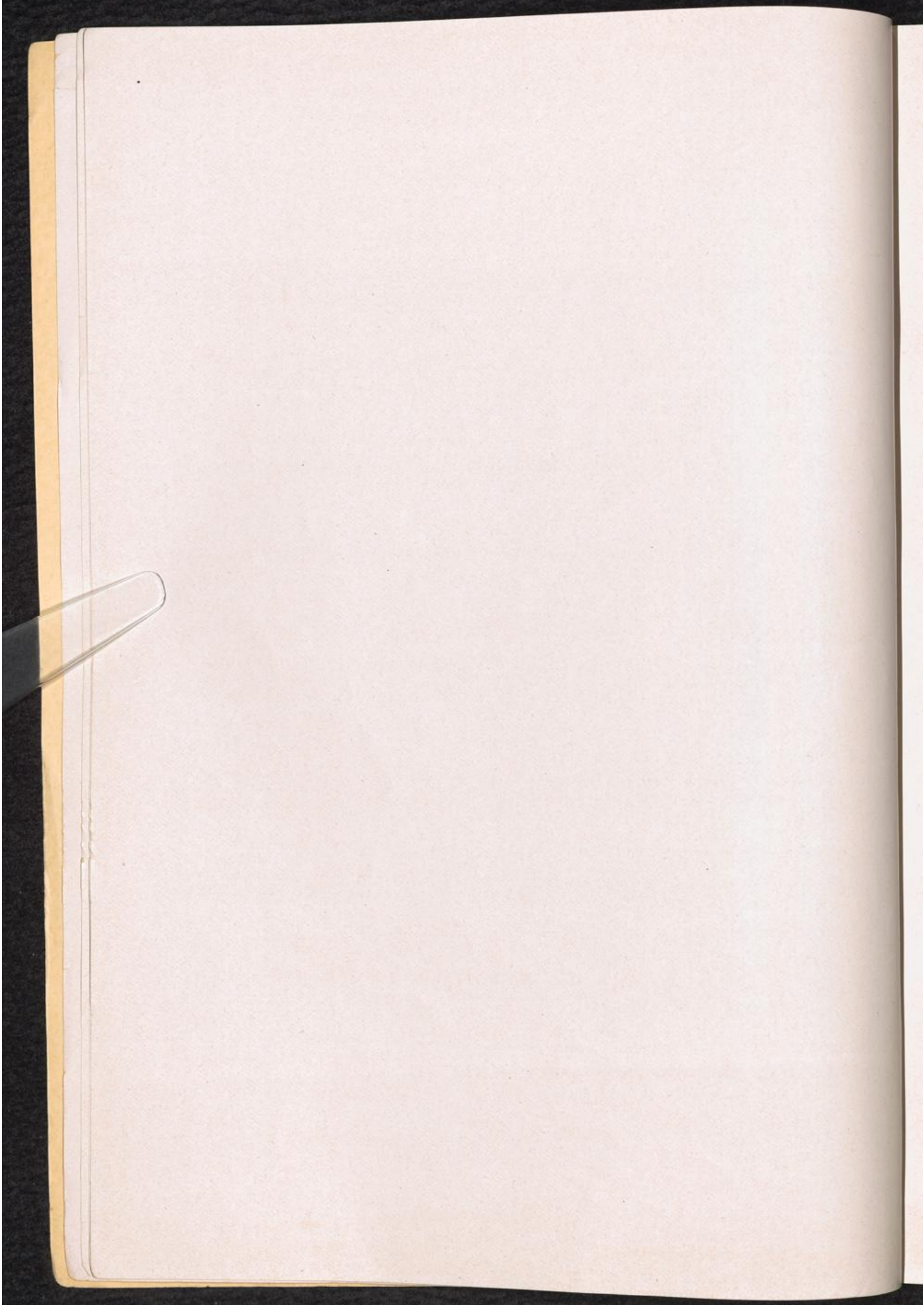
It was fully realised then as it is today, that in view of the large number of Concentration Camps, Labour detachments, Ghettos, Prisons, etc. which had been established by the Party in power to control Germans and the nationals of occupied territories and to further the war aims of Germany, in view also of their innumerable ramifications and the extreme complication of their administration, that it would be impossible to find and document each one of these installations correctly.

Although, therefore, the International Tracing Service cannot pretend to have exhausted the subject it feels that it should present to those who received Volumes I and II, this one hundred and twenty eight page supplement which records additional material found since March 1950 and which includes information not yet recorded relating to Jewish Ghettos established in various countries after 1939.

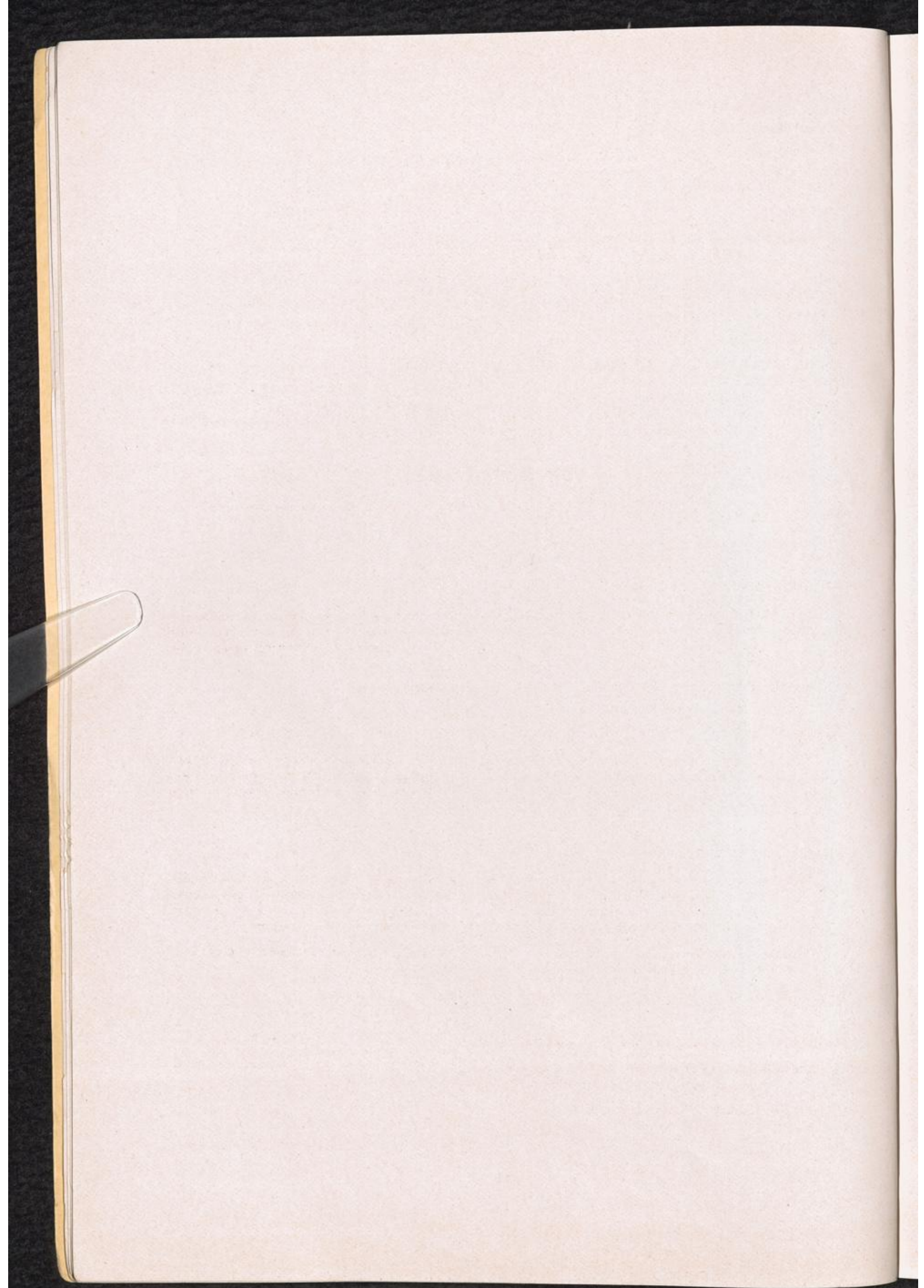

At this time about 1500 prisoners were working in a quarry, construction of roads and on the "SS-Gut". The prisoners had been loaded in railway trucks preparatory to evacuation to Theresienstadt when they were liberated on 5. 5. 45 by the Russians (former inmates).

Strafgefängenenlager Brest, established 1944, 1000 prisoners, including French and African PoW's, CC garments, working in a ship-yard (Statement of one former inmate, no other confirmation).

CERNAY — SENNHEIM

C—K 48/V 51

Add: SS-Training Camp, first mentioned May 1940. 700 of the 3000 Norwegian students arrested by the Reich commission in Oslo were deported to Germany. Some of them were sent to Buchenwald, others to the SS-Training camp Sennheim. In May 1940 Norwegian students were transferred from Buchenwald to Sennheim. When the Sennheim Camp was closed in Nov. 1944, the students were first sent to work near Freiburg/Br. and were later transferred to Buchenwald (OCC WC Nuernberg).
