Various Warcrime Actions (2 Folders)

Folder No 1:

1) Action NN Prisoners ("NN" e.g. Nacht und Nebel)

a) Secret letter of SS-Wirtschaftsverwaltungshauptamt, Amtsgruppe D -Konzentrationslager- addressed to the "Kommandanten der Konzentrationslager", giving decisions on treatment of NN prisoners, June 1943.

b) Decision re French NN prisoners, arrested in France and sent to German Concentration Camps.

Secret letter from "Befehlshaber der Sicherheitspolizei und des SD im Bereich des Militaerbefehlshabers in Frankreich" to the administration of the CC FLOSSENBERG/Weiden/Opf. Paris 14-6-44.

c) Secret letter from "Reichsminister der Justiz" to "Generalleutnant der Polizei Dr. Kaltenbrunner, Berlin SW 11, Prinz-Albrechtstr. 8" re the burial of NN prisoners whose relatives were not allowed to be informed of their deaths.

d) Directions given by the "Reichsminister der Justiz" re NN prisoners.

e) Statement of the priest Dr. Poelchau re the "NN decree". (Dr. Poelchau was dealing with prisoners before their execution. October 1946.

f) Statement of Mrs. Gertrud Leppin, nee Gruenberger, re the shooting during the night of 29th to 30th January 1945, when within 3 hours prisoners have been shot by the SS in SONNENBURG Zuchthaus (about 815 prisoners). 5-2-1947.

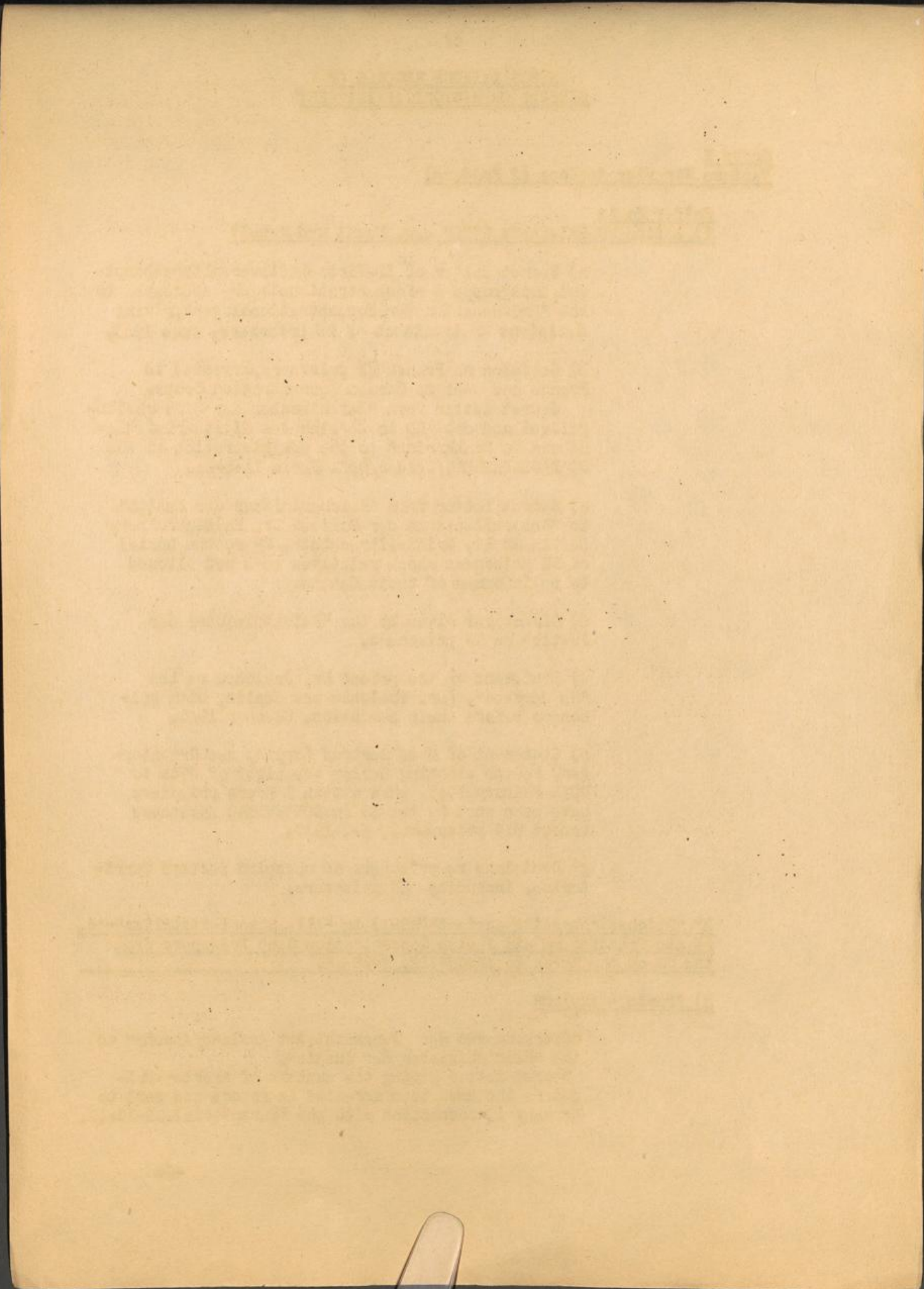
g) Decisions re prisoners of occupied Western Territories, including NN prisoners.

2) "Reichssicherheitshauptamt"(RSHA) to "Alle Stapoleitstellen"etc. re the Transfer of all Jewish Concentration Camp Prisoners from the CC of the Reich to AUSCHWITZ. 2-10-42.

3) "Porto - Aktion"

"Oberkommando der Wehrmacht, Amt Ausland/Abwehr" to the "Reichsminister der Justiz".

Secret letter giving the numbers of "Porto"-Prisoners who have been arrested in France and sent to Germany in connection with the "Porto" trial. 22-10-42.



4) Decision re the Deportation Of Some Luxembourgian Families

- a) Secret letter from the "Hoehere SS und Polizeifuehrer Ost" to HIMMLER re Luxembourgian families (300 families) who were accused to have acted against the Germans. 9-11-42.
- b) Shooting of 3 Luxembourgians (deserters) whose death sentences were changed to 15 years imprisonment. In spite of that they have been executed for having killed the "Ortsgruppenleiter" of the pro German movement in Luxemburg. The "Sonderkommando" of the prison SIEGBURG killed three innocent prisoners.

5) Decisions On Extermination Of The Mentally- and Nerve diseased.

- a) Sample of information letter re mentally diseased, not stating to relatives that the deceased had been deliberately killed, but giving cause of death as flue, pneumonia, blood-circulation trouble, etc.
- b) Letters from: Pfarrer LEUBEY Vertrauensmann d. Wuertt. Arbeitsgemeinschaft evangel. Seelsorger an Gemuets- und Nervenkranken",
"L. SCHLAICH, "Leiter der Heil- und Pflegeanstalt fuer Schwachsinnige und Epileptische, Stetten i.R., "
Standartenfuehrer "SCHIELE, "Muenchen etc.

showing the methods of exterminating the mentally diseased and, furthermore, the moral impression on the German population.

6) Aktion Meerschaum

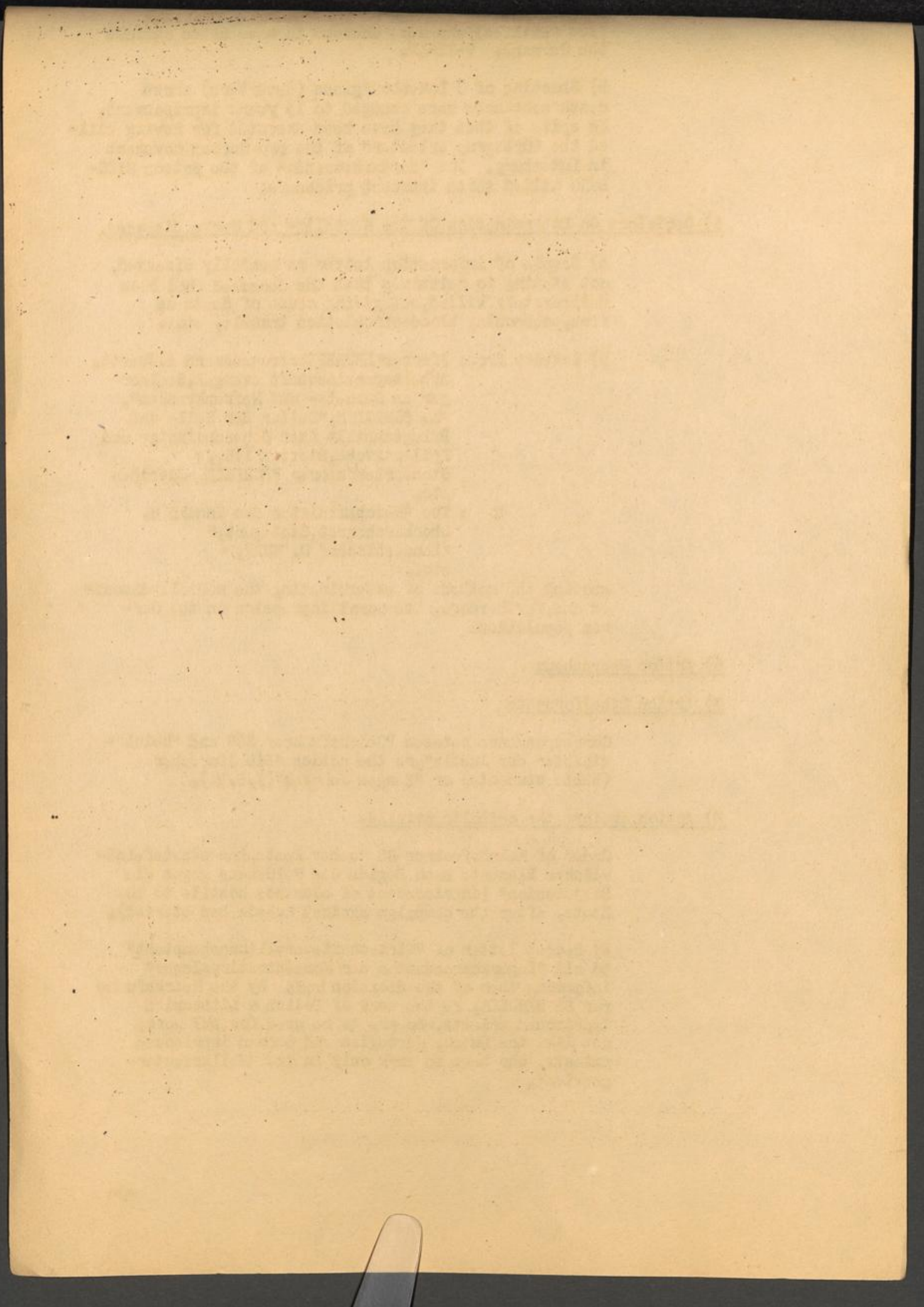
7) Aktion Bibelforscher

Correspondence between "Reichsfuehrer SS" and "Reichsminister der Justiz", re the action "Bibelforscher (bible students) or "Zeugen Jehovas"(I.B.V.).

8) Action against the catholic priests.

Order of Reichsfuehrer SS "ueber Festnahme staatsfeindlicher Elemente nach Beginn des Feldzuges gegen die Sowjetunion" (imprisonment of elements hostile to the State, after the campaign against Russia had started).

- b) Secret letter of "Wirtschaftsverwaltungshauptamt" to all "Lagerkommandanten der Konzentrationslager" informing them of the decision made by the Reichsfuehrer SS HIMMLER, re the work of Polish & Lithuanian imprisoned priests, who are to be used for ANY work, not like the Dutch, Norwegian and German imprisoned priests, who have to work only in the "Heilkrautergaerten".



9) Sonderkommando DIRLEWANGER

- a) Statement made by Albin Vogel, reporting the history of the formation of SS Brigade DIRLEWANGER. It consisted of former Concentration Camp prisoners and increased to 80 000 men. It was organized to fight the "partisans". Its first name was "Sonderkommando" and then its name was changed to "Sturmbrigade DIRLEWANGER" in autumn 1943. The sworn statement is translated into English. (Investigation Officer: Lt. Col. Albert G. Langeluttig, War Crimes Group APO 633-US Army).
- b) Statement of SS Oberfuehrer H. PISTER who was the commander of CC BUCHENWALD from 1942 to the end of the war; this statement concerns the recruiting of the Sonderkommando DIRLEWANGER, saying that it consisted of incorrigible criminals (who had been in penitentiary for many years before).
The statement was made before J. PETERSEN, AGO Nr D/416833, U.S. Civilian in Dachau, 14-1-1947.

10) War Crimes (P.O.T.)

- a) Secret order from the chief SIPO and S.D. to the commander of GROSS-ROSEN re the transport of Soviet prisoners of war to the concentration camps for extermination, saying that all those who, due to their poor physical condition will probably collapse on the way to the CCs, are to be excluded from the transports - in order to prevent the general public becoming aware of these SS activities.
- b) Cremation of bodies - War Crimes. A document showing the extermination and cremation of prisoners in half a day, 13-1-45.

Folder No 2:

1) Action of Reichsminister ROSENBERG:
Decision re the confiscation of furniture of Jewish Owners
in Western occupied territories, e.g. "MOEBELAKTION"
(See also Group IV Folder No 2-14)

- a) Orders and reports re this confiscation. (The suggestion was made by Reichsminister ROSENBERG after agreement with HITLER). The Chief of Reichskanzlei made the "Stabsfuehrer des Einsatzstabes fuer die besetzten Gebiete Pz UTIKAL" responsible for this action on 25-3-42. Responsibility for this action is given to "Reichsministerium Dienststelle Westen".
- b) List of furniture of Jewish people kept in various stores in France. The store owners had to make a complete list and report on Jewish Furniture to the "Dienststelle Westen of Reichsminister fuer die besetzten Ostgebiete". Furthermore, correspondence re this action.
- c) Correspondence with various stores and transport houses, also "Prefecture de Police", PARIS, referring to "M"-action, e.g. "MOEBELAKTION".

2) Booty and Confiscation in the Old Occupied France
(Beute und Beschlagnahme im altbesetzten Frankreich)
Secret decision by KEITEL, dated 27-5-1943.

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3) Hostage Action, "Measures of Atonement" taken by the commander of the "Armed Forces" in France in order to prevent sabotage. Attached is a statistical card of shot hostages

Group II (1 Folder)

Various Decisions Re Occupied Territories,
Germanization Of Foreign Children, re
"Lebensbornheime" etc.

- 1) Order of "Reichsfuehrer SS HIMMLER", Chief of "Rasse- und Siedlungshauptamt SS" given to various offices, re the selection of Polish "Sippen"(families) who are found "worthy" enough for Germanization(Eindeutschung), and his decisions on how to deal with the rest. Berlin 9-11-1940.
- 2) "Aktion Zigeunerbaron". Orders of "Chef des Generalstabes der 2. Panzerarmee" to "Chef des Generalstabes der Heeresgruppe Mitte" re evacuation of occupied territories, treatment of the population, propaganda and recruiting for work in Germany. Also dealing with the captured property of occupied territories in Russia.
- 3) Decision of installation of children and half-grown youths assembly camps(Kinder und Halbwuechsigen Sammellagers) in KL LUBLIN.
- 4)a) Secret letters re Polish children to be kept in "Kindern und Halbwuechsigen Sammellagern" and "Lebensbornheimen". These children who were mostly orphans had a special "polizeil. Meldestelle" (so that no relatives could reach them) - for the purpose of their Germanization (Eindeutschung).

b) Germanization order re children of 2-6 and 6-12 years of age from Polish families or orphanages.
- 5)"Heu-Aktion". An action of evacuating the youth, also those less than 15 years of age, from the territory of the "Heeresgruppe Mitte" in the territory to the "Reich" for the purpose of weakening the enemy "biologically" for a considerable time suggestion originating from the "Fuehrer" and HIMMLER.
- 6) Order from the "Reichskommissar fuer Festigung deutschen Volkstums" to the "Hoeheren SS und Polizeifuehrer" re treatment of Polish Civilian workers and prisoners of war, who had relations with German women and who are to be examined, to see if they are fit for Germanization (Eindeutschung).

Installation Of New Concentration Camps and "A.E.L."

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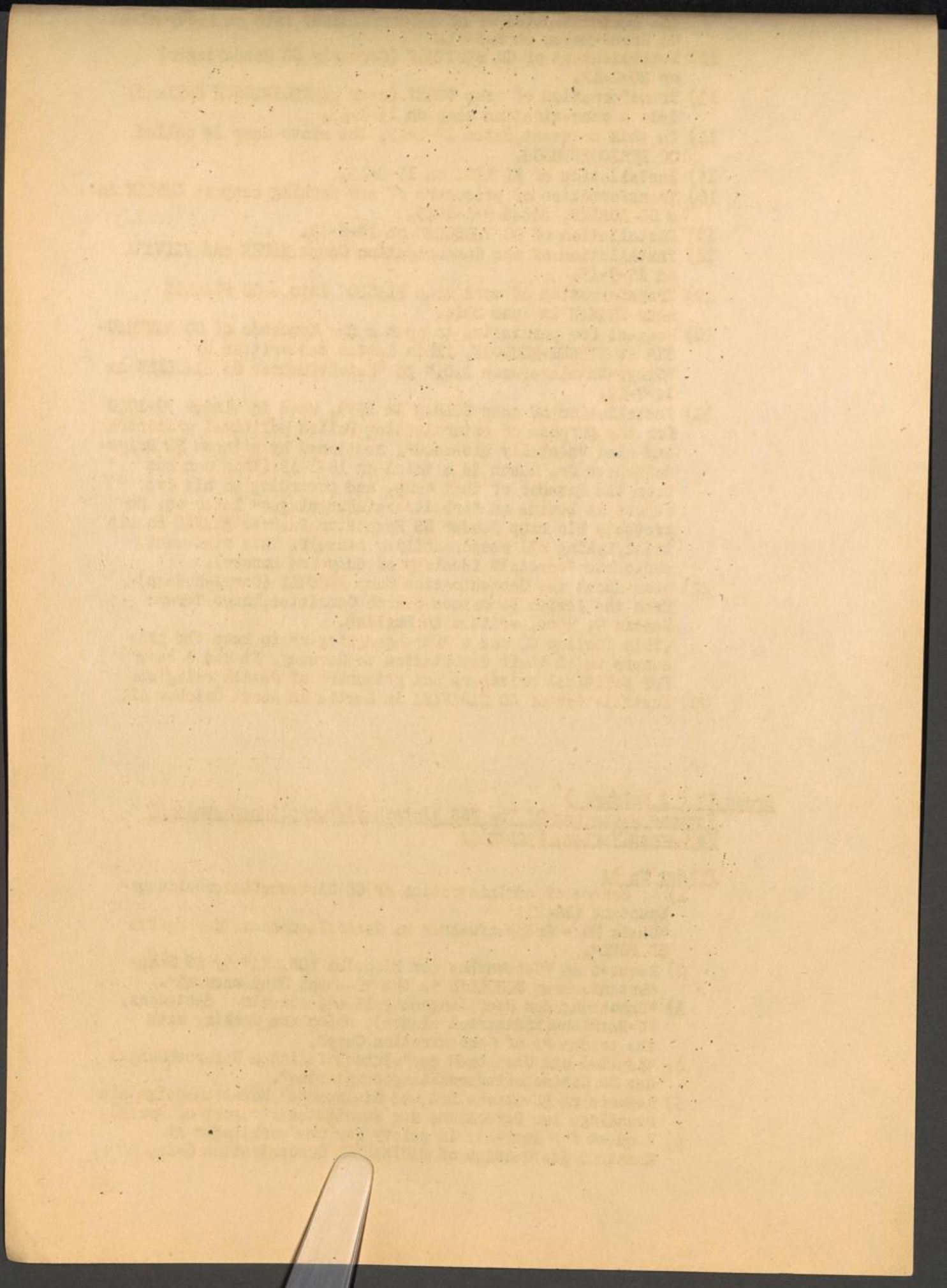
- 7) Establishing of A.E.L. RECKLINGHAUSEN in February 1941.
- 8) Closing of A.E.L. RECKLINGHAUSEN in March 1943.
- 9) Installation of A.E.L. ESSEN MUELHEIM Flughafen in June 1941.
- 10) Installation of Kdo. STRUTHOF (stone pit) Kdo. of NATZWEILER, in March 1941.
- 11) Transformation of Arbeitslager GROSS-ROSEN (formerly under the administration of CC SACHSENHAUSEN) into an independent CC Gross-Rosen on 1-5-41.
- 12) Establishment of CC STUTTHOF (formerly SS Sonderlager) on 20-2-42.
- 13) Transformation of camp VUGHT (near HERTOGENBOSCH Holland) into a concentration camp on 15-1-43.
- 14) In this document, dated 18-1-43, the above camp is called CC HERZOGENBUSCH.
- 15) Installation of KL RIGA on 15-3-43.
- 16) Transformation of prisoners of war working camp at LUBLIN in a CC LUBLIN, dated 9-4-1943.
- 17) Installation of CC WARSCHAU on 15-8-43.
- 18) Installation of the Concentration Camps KAUN and VAIVARA on 15-9-43.
- 19) Transformation of work camp PLASZOW into a CC PLASZOW near KRAKAU in June 1944.
- 20) Request for permission to open a new Kommando of CC MAUTHAUSEN at WIENER-NEUDORF. (This letter was written by "Stayr-Daimler-Pusch A.G." to "Reichsfuehrer SS HIMMLER" on 14-7-43.
- 21) Installation of camp SOLDAN in 1939, used in winter 39-1940 for the purpose of exterminating Polish political prisoners and also "mentally diseased", mentioned by witness SS Brigadefuehrer Dr. Rasch in a trial on 16-6-43. (This man has been the founder of that camp, and according to his own report it became an "Arbeitserziehungslager" later on. He protects his camp leader SS Hauptsturmfuehrer KRAUSE in his trial, taking all responsibility himself. This statement shows his "special" ideology of duty and honour).
- 22) News about the Concentration Camp FOSSOLI (Carpi-Modena) from the Jewish Deportees Search Committee, Lungo Tevere Sanzio 9, Rome, written in English. (This Italian CC was a "Durchgangslager" to keep the prisoners until their deportation to Germany. It was a camp for political prisoners and prisoners of Jewish religion).
- 23) Installation of CC ZASAVIZA in Serbia in about October 41.

Various Decisions Of The "SS Wirtschaftsverwaltungshauptamt"
Re German Wartime Economics

- 7) Contract re a Society "Ostdeutsche Baustoffwerke G.m.b.H." re No 1010.
- 8) Letter of Reichsmarschall GOERING re his "4 Jahresplan" - building of BUNA-WERKE in AUSCHWITZ, decision for this purpose.
- 9) An article written by Wilhelm Ritter von SCHRAMM re the supply of the German Army during the Field Operation in Russia. It shows the various problems met by the Quatermaster and the importance of his job in the Field Operations. (This article has been published under the title "Der Quartiermeister" in the Berliner Boersenzeitung. The British Broadcasting Cooperation has quoted this article on 21-12-1943).
- 10) Meeting of the "Jaegerstab" on 9-6-1944.

Folder No 2:

- 1) Secret letter from the "Chief des SS Wirtschaftsverwaltungshauptamtes" to the "Chief der Verwaltung Oranienburg", advising him in which way to deal with the various valuables found in the pockets of prisoners clothes.
- 2) Letter of "Wirtschaftsverwaltungshauptamt" to "Lagerkommandanten der Konzentrationslager" in August 1942, re death cases of Soviet prisoners, their arrival or transfer. In order to save work and paper, only the numbers of same had to be checked by the RSHA - no "Lagerkarteikarten" were to be made for Soviet Prisoners.
- 3) Letter from "Wirtschaftsverwaltungshauptamt" to "Lagerkommandanten der Konzentrationslager" advising on how to avoid it becoming official that an eastworker has died as a prisoner of a Concentration Camp, and that for political reasons the relatives of the dead prisoner are only to be informed about the death by the "Arbeitsamt" and never by the Concentration Camps. 25-3-43.
- 4) Decisions made by the "Wirtschaftsverwaltungshauptamt" given to "Lagerkommandanten der Konzentrationslager" in order to simplify the death reports of the different kinds of CC prisoners for the purpose of saving work and paper.
- 5) Sample of Information Letter re one death & cremation, not letting the relatives know that the person died in a Concentration Camp.
- 6) Transfer of Russian civilian workers into Concentration Camps for the purpose of having cheap labour.
- 7) Complaint of "Arbeitseinsatzfuhrer" of CC BUCHENWALD to "Chef des Amtes X, Berlin" (an office subordinated to "Wirtschaftsverwaltungshauptamt") that the selection of prisoners in good state of health has not been made in a correct way for BUCHENWALD.
- 8) Letter of "Arbeitseinsatz CC BUCHENWALD" to "ATG-Maschinenbau GmbH Leipzig" re 500 prisoners to be sent for work to this factory, and who are to be accompanied by the necessary guards (Wachmannschaften).
- 9) Discussions re economical questions of Steinbruch BLIZYN.
- 10) Letter of "Reichsminister und Chef der Reichskanzlei" Dr. LAMMERS to "Reichsminister der Justiz" Dr. GUERTNER re occupation of "Sicherungsverwahrten".
- 11) Regulations of "Hauptamt Haushalt und Bauten" to "Kommandanten der Konzentrationslager" re transfer of prisoners for work. The order says that only prisoners in good state of health have to be chosen.

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- 12) "SS Wirtschaftsverwaltungshauptamt" to "Kommandanten der Konzentrationslager" re the property of executed prisoners. (Reproaches for carelessly treated packages, which partly broke open and displayed bloodstained clothing of executed persons).
- 13) Various statistical reports and accounts re Nazi-Wartime economics.
- 14) Decisions re property of Jewish people sent to AUSCHWITZ.
- 15) Decisions made by "Wirtschaftsverwaltungshauptamt" to "Lagerkommandanten der Konzentrationslager" re death certificates for eastworkers and Polish civilian workers who are not suitable for Germanization.
- 16) "Chef des Haushaltamtes" to "Rechnungschef des Deutschen Reiches". Examination of the accounts of CC STUTTHOF near DANZIG, 2-9-42.
- 17) "Der Chef des Wirtschaftsverwaltungshauptamtes General der Waffen SS" FOHL to "Amtsgruppe D" SS Gruppenfuehrer GLUECKS re the clothing problem of prisoners, advising that the prisoners be taught to take more care of their clothing, November 1944.

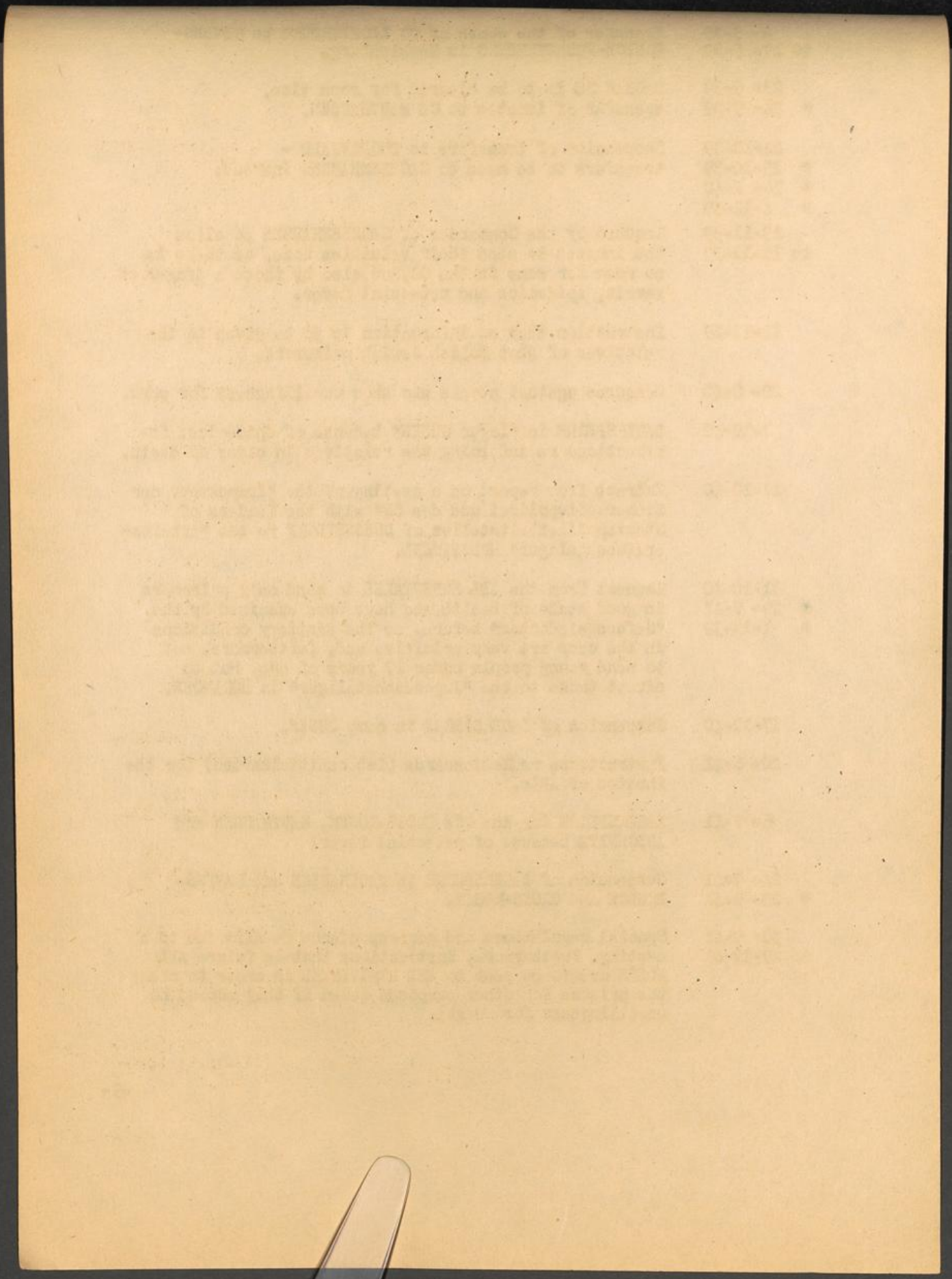

20- 4-42 Request to the "Reichsfuehrer SS und Chef d. deutschen Polizei, Berlin" by "SS Obergruppenfuehrer u. General d. Polizei SCHMAUSER," to revoke the recall of 135 "Polizeireservisten" at the "Dienststellen" of the "Reichskommissar" fd FdV, Kattowitz and at the "Sonderbeauftragten des RF SS u. ChdDtPol. fuer fremdvoelkischen Arbeits-einsatz Sosnowitz", as they are urgently needed for supervising the CC workers who soon will be increased to about 5 000, and who are working for important war plants like Degussa-Gleiwitz, Krupp-Breslau, Elektra-Oberlasitz, Leichtmetall-Ratibor. And, furthermore, that another team of 80 policemen is needed. A camp with Polish workers, who are supposed to be kept separately is going to be arranged and one for Jewish expert concrete workers.

21- 5-42 Instructions and samples showing the way in which relatives are to be informed of the deaths of CC inmates. Relatives of all deceased CC inmates are allowed to come and see them for the last time, except in the cases of Poles & Jews and those who belonged to Category III - transfer of bodies is not allowed. These will be cremated.
(FS - decree Nr. 2442 of 23-6-42 IV D5 - 46.85).

3- 7-42 (see also: 7-7-, 10-7-, and 7-9-42) Regulation re Russian civilian workers who tried to escape.
Sonderzug "Heinrich" - Agreement re the transport of 250 women inmates from RAVENSBRUECK to LUEBECK.

28- 7-42 Decree re special measures on supervising
to 7- 8-42 of prisoners of war. "Secret command matter" by supreme command of the German Armed Forces. (Attached to it is an English translation of same).

1- 9-42 (see also: 22-6-43 * 5-9-44) Regulations re the effects of deceased cc inmates, which are to be returned to their relatives, except those of Poles, Jews and Soviets (which have to be sent to the "Oberfinanzpraesidenten" who is to use them "in Favour of the Reich").

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- 4-10-42 As per decree of 29-9-42 all Jewish women are to be transferred from CC RAVENSBUECK to CC AUSCHWITZ, it follows that RAVENSBUECK will be free of them in future.
- 17-12-42 (see also: 10-1- to 4-2-43) Order of "Chef der Sicherheitspolizei und des SD" re the decree of "Reichsfuehrer SS HIMMLER" from 14-12-42, according to which at least 35 000 foreign workers have to be sent for work into CCs, and advising at the same time to cover this action as "unerlaessliche sicherheitspolizeiliche Massnahme" to offices which have not to deal with it.
- 23-12-42 Instructions and measures re foreign "Arbeitserziehungshaftlinge" (persons to be brought up and taught to work correctly).

The history of "THIELBECK" in French:

The ship was used in April 45 to transport prisoners of NEUENGAMME, about 2800, to the SS "CAP ARCONA". On May 3rd the THIELBECK and the ARCONA were in the port of NEUSTADT, the bay of LUEBECK when at 11 a.m. she sank in 20 minutes, due to an air-raid. Only very few people could be saved.

5 years later the wreck was salvaged in LUEBECK port. This work was performed by the "Kessel u. Schiffreinigungsfirma Walter LUHR" under the supervision of the "Wasserschutz-und Kriminalpolizei LUEBECK, assisted by Lt. AUBOIROUX, leader of the French mission, different German representatives and many doctors engaged by the "French Mission". The investigation was completed on 15-3-50. The bodies and bones found were buried in the "ARCONA-FRIEDHOF" of NEUSTADT. All details re identification are given in these documents.

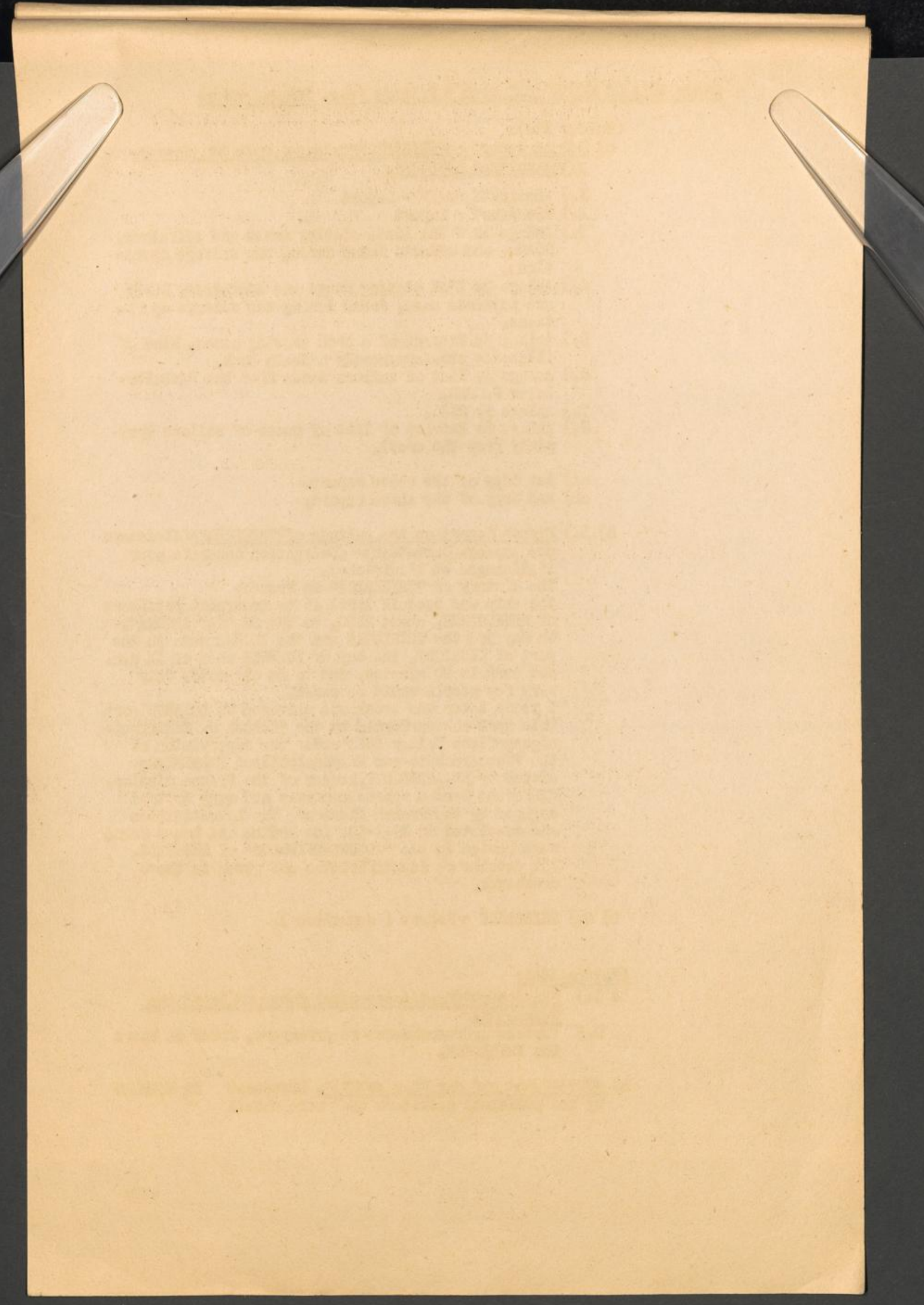

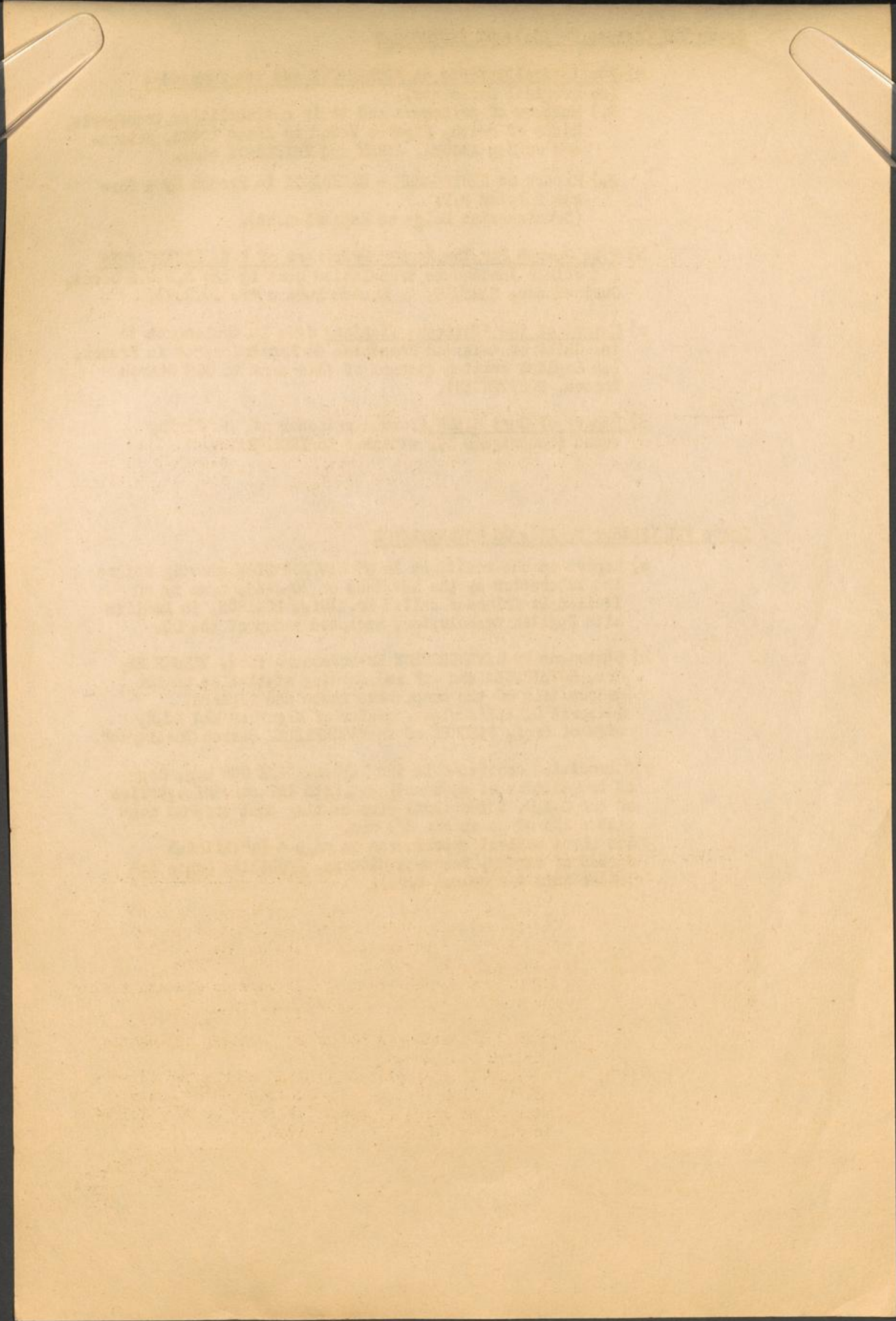

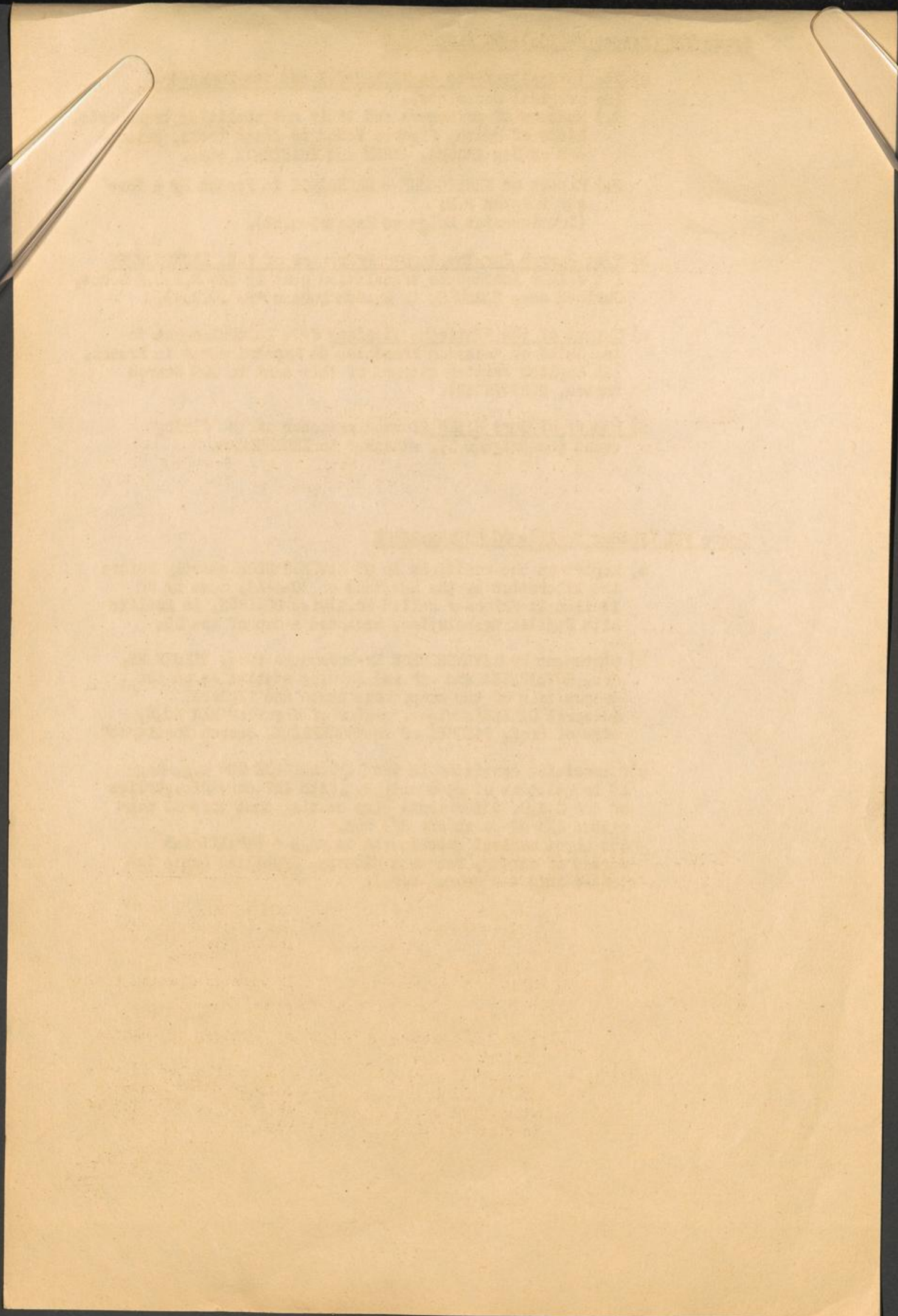
